#### **Featured Speakers**

This year we are fortunate to have three featured speakers: Sona Charaipotra, Andrea Wang, and Kyle Lukoff. Sona Charaipotra will follow the annual business meeting on Friday, and she and Andrea Wang will be signing books following Sona's keynote. Sona Charaipotra is the author of several novels, including How Maya Got Fierce and Symptoms of a Heartbreak, and co-author (with Dhonielle Clayton) of the Tiny Pretty Things duology and The Rumor Game. Andrea Wang will speak at our first session on Saturday morning (9 a.m.). She is the author of several children's books, including Watercress, which received several awards, including the Caldecott Medal, a Newberry Honor, and the Asian/Pacific American Award for Literature. Kyle Lukoff will speak at our Past Presidents' Luncheon on Saturday. He is a former elementary librarian and the author of books including Too Bright to See, which was shortlisted for the National Book Award, received the Stonewall Book Award, and was named a Newberry Honor Book. He will also be signing books after his presentation. IATE Author of the Year Allison Joseph will be signing at that time as well. Books can be purchased at the conference from Brain Lair Books, an independent bookstore.

IATE is a 100+ year organization. We have a tradition of great leadership. We would love the opportunity to mentor new individuals to join us as we continue to serve as the oldest English professional organization in the state of Illinois. If you are interested in a leadership position, following is informationsummarized from the IATE Constitution that will be helpful.

- 1.To be eligible for office, an individual must have been a member for at least five years preceding the year in which nominated.
- 2. For any vacant positions, including the Second Vice President, the chair of the Nominating Committee will seek nominations. Each nominee must submit a vita to the committee.
- 3. The committee will submit one nominee for each office to the Executive Committee for approval. At least one nominee per position must be approved by the Executive Council.
- 4. If someone would like to be nominated from the floor, they need to present a signed petition (25 signature minimum) at the Annual Fall Conference.
